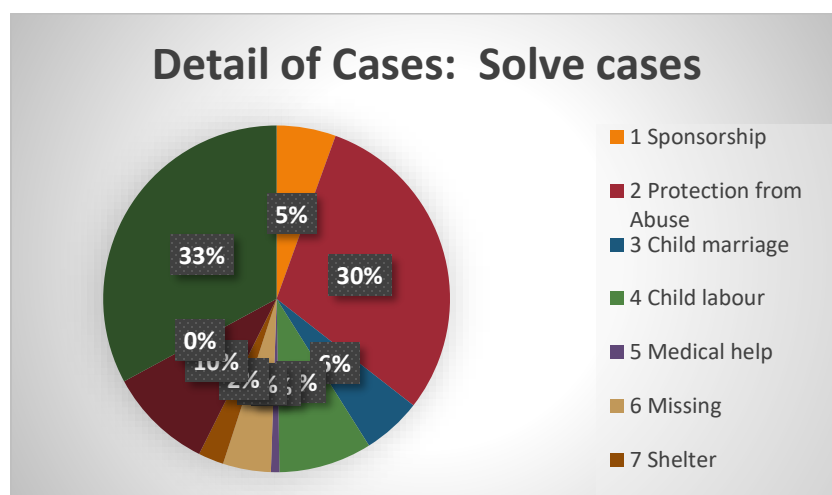
The creations of a child friendly nation where children are ensure of their rights and looked upon as contributing citizens of the nation.

### Safe Village Program

The Safe Village Program, Supported by Operation Red Alert-May Choice Foundation, Hyderabad, is to be conducted in selected 50 villages of Bundi, Kota, Bhilwara, and Chitorgarh in Rajasthan.

**Objective** – Prevent the trafficking of Children, particularly girls for sexual exploitation, from the villages in India.

#### **Activities –**

Pre-SVP - During the pre-svp, the concerned people are contacted and interacted to organize programs between Anganwadi center, secondary or higher secondary school and community in the village.

SVP (Safe Village program) – The predetermined activity the program is done in the school first. pre-test and post-test. In the pre-test children are asked about their rights, knowledge of the law for children and child trafficking. Supporting material the program is done through comic book, film-show and drama. Post-tests of children are taken after the program is over in school. Comic book is distributed to all children. One of the students is selected as Rakshak and Anganwadi worker or school teacher one of these two is selected as Nodal Teacher. Film shows with women, men and children are organized along with mothers and fathers and community at the Anganwadi center.

#### **Achievement Summary –**

1. 4 Rakshak was selected.
2. 4 Nodal Teacher was selected.
3. 4 Gram Mitra (Elder men) was selected.
4. The 4 SVPs & 4 re-visit SVPs with 99 mothers, 89 fathers, 158 elderly, 386 students, 370 community members (Male's, Female's, Adolescent and Children's).

### YUVAAH PAHAL – Project

**Objective** : Strengthening adolescent and youth group to play an active role in prevention of child marriage, violence against children and strengthening of Yuwaah initiatives in state of Rajasthan.

Celebration of 'International Girls Day' on 11th October 2021 in Sohela Girls federation and Government School Piploo 35 girls participated in a discussion on Cyber Safety and girl's empowerment.

Gandhi Darshan week was celebrated in Piploo Government Girls College and School in collaboration with the Block Administration.



Project Team- Ms. Priyanka Singh, Mr. Sitaram Sharma and Mr. Krishna Singh participated in Youth Parliament at IGSS Jaipur on 25th November and discussed youth policy.

Child Rights Week celebrated from 14 to 20 November under which the following activities—

- Youth Resource Center Opening in Barwas Panchayat in Todaraisingh through Community Support.
- Children's meetings and special sessions organized in 10 schools and colleges with 455 youths and adolescent girls (112 Male 343 Female) to discuss important laws related to child rights such as Right to Education, Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses Act 2012 and Prohibition of Child Marriage Act 2006, information also about the child helpline (1098)



Workshop on the topic of child marriage with NSS (National Service Scheme) volunteers in 4 colleges- Tonk, Deoli and Bundi organized with 377 youths (178 Male, 199 Female) in

During the "Prashasan gaon ke sangabhiyan" campaign 6 boys and girls linked with Palanhar Yojna through forms fill up in 8 different camps.

Reformation and capacity building of the Panchayat Level Child Protection Committee in 4 Panchyats participated in this Meeting 82 person (64 Male & 18 Female).

SSSR and NYKS together organized workshop on Child marriage at Govt School, Lawa, Malpura, 37 volunteers participated.

Collaboration with NYKS organized one day Fit India workshop at Uniyara, Tonk NYKS volunteers got acquainted with the importance of physical and mental health, positive life style, yoga meditation, road safety, and issues related to child marriage. And 02 days block level sports competition at Sandeda Farm village in which 100 adolescent youths participated in the event.

Capacity building session about child marriage and protection of child from violence to 53 NSS volunteers and other college faculty and staffs at Govt college, Todaraisingh block of Tonk district and also distributed college bags to NSS members.





Workshops on the issue of violence against children, child rights ; what is violence, types and reason of emotional, physical, mental, sexual violence understood with 105 adolescent girls in 10 federations.

Celebrated National Youth Day at Palda with 46 adolescent girls on the occasion of birth anniversary of social reformer Swami Vivekanand and also acquainted with child rights and violence against children.

Capacity building and awareness session for youths and adolescent federation about Child rights, violence, types of violence, precautions from violence, Child line helpline number and about the law against Child rights violation. In this session 163 girls were the participants.

One-day orientation on career guidance opportunities and skill development was conducted with the 53 youth in Darda Turki Tonk. Kathmana village of Tonk district with 50 participants resource by Mr Brijesh Pardiwal from Kaushal Vikash Kendra and Mr Nisar Ahmed from Child line.

One day workshop for Gram Panchayat Authorities, Child Protection Committee and local leaders about violence and Child marriage in 10 villages – Fyawari, Bagri, Jola, Sohela, Dardaturki, Janwali, Naner, Dodwari, Galod and Kathmana 200 participants attended the session out of which 124 were male and 76 were females.

03 Social protection camp participants 415, first 2 social protection camp in Bairwa, Darmshala, Sohela And Dev Vidhya Mandir School Dardaturki to link potential children/families for various government entitlements sponsors during covid pandemic 215 Beneficiaries', Katmana 100 and Barwas 100 Benefited. During the camp, information about various social security schemes like : Palanhar, Mukhyamantri Hunar Vikash Yojana, Sahyog awam Uphar Yojana, Student Scholarship, Apki Beti Yojana, Mukhyamantri Hamari Beti Yojana, Gargi Puraskar Evam Protsahil Yojana, Rajshree Yojana etc.

Participated in Panchayat level Child Protection Committee Meeting in Fyawari and Darda Turki in Tonk District. During the meeting, it was discussed to get 100% Covid vaccination done, as well as the formation of a task force at the panchayat level for prevention of child marriage also discussed.

Under UNICEF's YPAT youths program Shailendra Singh from Bijulpura and Vasundhara Prajapat from Dardaturki got selected.

Youth Vasundhara Prajapat awarded with International Women inspiration by Subh Vichar Sanstha at Jaipur on the occasion of Women Day.

Women's Day celebration on 08<sup>th</sup> March at Police Station, Piploo with adolescent girls and women 35 and 14 Men participated.

Establishment of Youth Excellence Centre at Kathmana has been done in which Library, career counseling, Spoken English, mental health session are been planned. In the month of March total 7 girls and 14 boys got registered at the centre.

- ✓ To create awareness about safe motherhood so that maternal & infant mortality can be reduce.



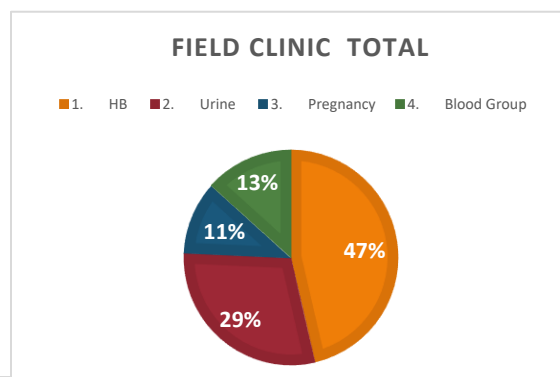
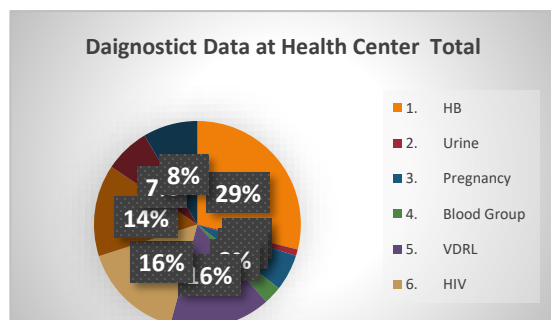

## FEMINIST AND ADOLESCENT YOUTH LED ACTION (FAYA) PROJECT

**Project Development Objective :** Young generation able to take full advantage of tools and services to control their sexual health with support by PFI New Delhi in 100 villages of Tonk, Todaraingh & Talera block in Tonk & Bundi District in Rajasthan (India) from 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019 – 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2021.

### Outcomes

1. young people are better informed about SRHR and empowered to voice their needs and rights
2. Increased access to formal education for girls at risk of and affected by child marriage
3. Increased access to child protection systems for girls at risk of and affected by child marriage
4. Increased utilization of SRHR services that are responsive to the needs of young people, particular girls at risk of and affected by child marriage





5. Increased engagement and collective social action against child marriage and in support of Adolescent SRHR.

### Major Achievements :

**Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) Session** - TOT's and 6 to 12 sessions of Module 2, 3 and Module 4 on Body Diversity, Diversity - Family and Love, Sex, Healthy and Unhealthy Relationships, Impact of the Image of Real Man, Agency and Assertive Communication, Consent and Violence and Contraception and Abortion conducted successfully with 2300 adolescents in Tonk. And Session of module 4th to 2300 adolescent girls in Bundi with strong and assertive dialogue and the real man's image, violence and consent, RTI STI and abortion and contraception sessions.



**Special Day Calibration Through Online & offline Platform-** Through the special day : World Health Day, Menstruation Hygiene Day, Youth Day and International Girls Day celebration, the reach of 135 adolescent girls in Tonk and 150 Adolescent in Bundi encouraged to raise their voice and discuss sexual and reproductive health rights.

**Gate Keeper Meetings:** Dialogue held on gender discrimination, menstrual hygiene and increase participation of adolescent girls in sessions with 20 participants in 2 villages (Lamba and Goharpura). And Zoom call meeting organized on the topic of RKSK, program is running and what is the Purpose, it was discussed in detail.

**Operation of Youth Resource Center (YRC)-** Super Saathi Center (Youth Resource Center) Established at Gram Panchayat Chanbas Surya supported by Sarpanch in the school premises Inaugurated by SDM Todaraisingh on 21 September 2021.

**Selection of 500 Kishore Mitra for session conducting with Adolescents** - Kits distributed to 150 Kishor Mitras sessions conducted with 1680 Adolescents In Tonk. And 230 kits to selected KM, and also held meetings with them to orient them on how we have to conduct the session
