ACTIVITIES IN DETAIL

SSSR undertakes activities in different field which can be categorized and described Theme wise as:

Theme I. CHILD RIGHTS (EDUCATION)

YUVAAH PAHAL – Project

Objective : Strengthening adolescent and youth group to play an active role in prevention of child marriage, violence against children and strengthening of Yuwaah initiatives in state of Rajasthan” (Yuwaah Pahal)

Achievements :

Workshop with NYKS, NSS, Scouts and Guide and other community youth- organized workshops targeting **6879 youth** participants from various organizations, such as NYKS (Nehru Yuva



Kendra Sangathan), NSS (National Service Scheme), Scouts and Guide, and other community youth members. The workshops aimed to cover topics related to Child Rights and Protection, including issues such as Child Marriage, Violence against children and POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences), Child Labour, and Gender bias discrimination and identities. Presumably provides additional information about the

individuals involved in the workshops. rights such as Right to Education, Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012 and Prohibition of Child Marriage Act 2006, information also about the child helpline (1098).

Workshop with PRI Members and Community influencers - Workshop with PRI (Panchayati Raj Institution) Members and Community stakeholders, which included participants such as Ward panch (ward members of the local self-government institution), Anganwadi Worker (a frontline worker in the Integrated Child Development Services program), Religious leader, and Community social activists

Monthly Meeting with Adolescent Girls (Federation) - Workshops were conducted with adolescent girls in 50 villages of Tonk district. The sessions focused on discussing issues such as Child Marriage, Gender identity, and bias. The girls were inspired by stories of fighter girls who had overcome these challenges and empowered others. They learned how to deal with such situations and supported each other. The



workshops aimed to raise awareness, empower the girls, and foster a sense of solidarity in addressing their challenges.

Awareness campaign - An awareness campaign on the prevention of Child Marriage was conducted through a vehicle rally in 160 villages. The campaign involved 500 youth and community representatives directly associated with its success. Additionally, approximately 25,000 other community stakeholders benefited from the campaign through the distribution of posters, pamphlets, booklets, and other IEC materials. In total, the campaign reached and impacted 25,500 youth, community members, and representatives.

Social Security Schemes Camps- Organized in 12 villages to provide support to the youth and raise awareness about Social Security Schemes. Through these camps, we successfully linked and raised awareness among a total of 197 young males and 426 young females.

A Divisional Level Workshop was organized in three districts: Ajmer, Kota, and Jodhpur. The



workshop brought together stakeholders from various government departments and private organizations who work with or are linked to youth, focusing on topics related to child rights and child protection issues. The workshop aimed to discuss challenges, create a way forward plan, and invited experts to facilitate sessions for effective delivery. Participants included

representatives from NSS, university lecturers, CWC members, DCPU members, SJE representatives, WCD representatives, ICDC representatives, and Child Line.

Three special days, namely Menstruation Hygiene Day, World Youth Skills Day, and Children's Day (focused on career counseling and stress management), were celebrated with **115 youths**. Additionally, the World Day Against Child Labour was celebrated in Tonk district through a collaboration involving four government departments and private organizations: **Child Line, Labour Department, DCR, and Police Department**

A 'Youth Excellence Centre' has been established in Kathmana village, Tonk district, to provide career counselling and support for mental health issues. The centre has enrolled a total of **35 youth** who are receiving assistance in these areas.

Information, Communication, and Education (ICE) materials were developed on the most prevalent issues in the Tonk district, namely Child Marriage and Violence against children. A total of **500 booklets on Child Marriage and 1000 booklets on Violence against children** were designed, printed, and distributed among various villages in the Tonk district.

To conclude the project and share progress reports and various case stories, invitations were extended to different departments, private organizations, and community representatives. Some of the invitees included NSS, NYKS, PRI members, media representatives, CWC, Child Line, schools, and youths.



She leads the change Project

She leads the change" The project is being run by Shiv Shiksha Samiti Ranoli with the financial support of EMpower/She Leads Fund in 3 Block (Piploo, Todaraisingh in Tonk and Talera block Bundi districts of Rajasthan.

The objective - **Till June 2023, The Nodal officer will be appointed, Formation of Block level Task force and build the positive environment on the child marriage prevention through advocacy with District collector by 3000 Adolescent girls both (Tonk & Bundi) District.**

Outcomes these three outcomes are as follows –

1. Adolescents will be well informed about their rights and the adverse effects of child marriage and they will be much empowered to raise their voice, needs and rights.
2. Awareness about child marriage will increase at the community level and for its prevention affirmative action and reporting will start in 30 panchayat villages.
3. Nodal officers will be appointed at the panchayat level by formation and activation in 2 districts, 3 blocks and 30 panchayat level child marriage task forces.

Detailed Report Activity wise –

Adolescent federations Formation and Capacity Building through Quarterly Meetings: The block level federation formed in all 03 block each block 50-50 adolescent girls participated and regular meeting and CB of member through 03 Quarterly Meeting with 110 federation member Each Block level Federation. During the meeting Discussed about Objective of Federation, Process, what, Why and legal aspects of Child marriage. The adolescent girls learned emotion management skills and child protection policy.



Monthly Meeting - Monthly meetings are organized with the members at the panchayat level to increase the capacity of Adolescent Federation members; each panchayat is discussed with five members. Federation members share the discussion held in the meeting with other girls in their school and locality.

Workshops with religious leaders and service providers of marriage programs on reporting and prevention of child marriage at the block level in association with Nodal officers - All the service providers providing support in the marriage program such as pandit, barber, Halwai, band owner, horse owner and printing press have been identified and listed, soon a workshop will be organized with them at the block level through the nodal officer for sensitization.

Sensitization of Media on child Marriage issue through workshop- A workshop organized with 36 media reporter in Tonk on 7th February 2023, sharing information about the project, sharing data on child marriage and expressed commitment to collective efforts for child marriage prevention and awareness.

DTF/BTF Formation and Quarterly Meetings for action on Child Marriage Prevention - Under the project, child marriage prevention task force formed in collaboration with the district administration and subdivision administration for effective action on child marriage and meetings organized at quarterly level to take action and provide capacity building on the subject of child marriage. Formation and Capacity building of Child Marriage Task Force at panchayat Level on Quarterly Meeting - In 30 gram panchayats of the project area, dialogue was held regarding formation of panchayat level task force. In which, according to the earlier order of the Panchayati Raj Department, it was agreed to constitute Panchayat level Child Protection Committees and make them work as a task force. Quarterly meetings are being organized in all 30 panchayats and action is being taken after discussing various issues of child protection like child marriage, violence, molestation. meeting details are as follows-

Special Day Celebration: On October 11, International Girl Child Day, from November 14 to 20, child rights week and on January 24, National Girl Child Day was organized with 624 Adolescents in the project area, during which activities like painting, sports, speech, etc. were organized.

Exposure and dialogue of Adolescent Federation with Child Marriage Prevention Mechanism at Block & District Level-

42 adolescent girls interacted with Child Marriage Prohibition Officer / Nodal Officer Varsha Sharma and Neha Mishra in Peeplu and Todaraisingh through the exposure and learned about the process of complaining about child marriage, the process of annulment of child marriage. During the exposure girls meet with police officers of Anti Human Trafficking Unit and child welfare committee members for knowing child protection system.



Advocacy by Federation Member –

- On September 29, 2022, a memorandum was submitted by the block level Adolescent Girls Federation Piploo and Todaraisingh to the SDM, in which a Memorandum was made to change the name of the Chief Minister Kanyadan Yojana run at the state level. The members demanded to give respect to the girl child by not considering it as an object of charity.



- Adolescent Federation Piploo raised voice through the media to inform about the problem of transportation at the district level for higher education and to stop the buses due to non-stopping of Rajasthan Roadways buses in Sohela village.
- Adolescent Federation Piploo members gave memorandum to Darda Turki Sarpanch demanding installation of sanitary napkin burning machine in panchayat and school.

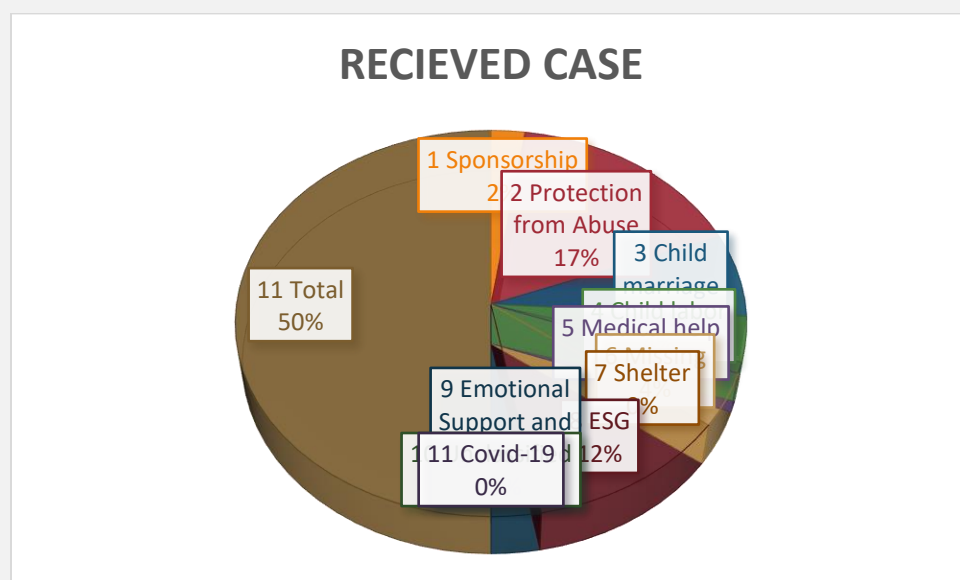

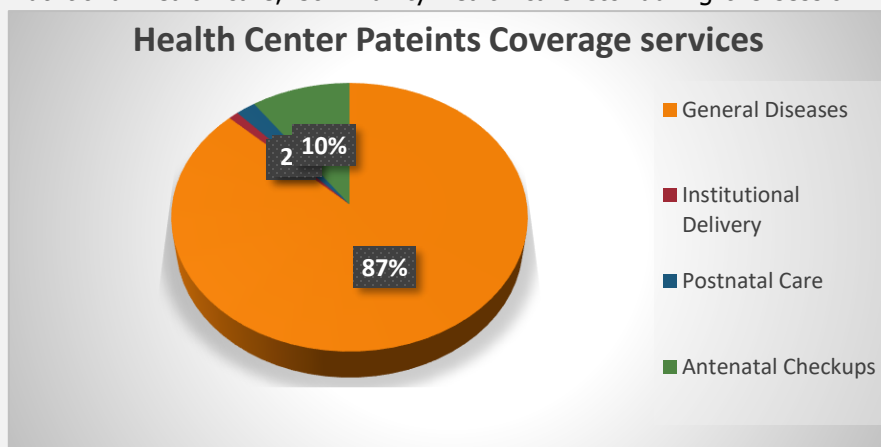

Aims & Objectives:

The major aim of this project is to benefit around 12,000 marginalized farmers spread across targeted 15 Districts in 5 States (Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Maharastra and Himachal Pradesh).



Whereas the major objectives comprise as follows.

- Benefit 10,000 farmers cultivating different crops by means of Advisory Mobile App, over two seasons.
- Engagement with NGO(s), allied Agriculture Institutes, organizations and companies across the agriculture sector to build a robust real-time agri-database.

Key Outcomes:

- Increase water use efficiency in agriculture – Rainwater harvesting, replenishing groundwater and use of appropriate water conservation practices
- Increase agricultural productivity which can provide livelihood for marginalized families.
- Promotion and enhancement of agriculture-based livelihood options through four water approach
- Enhance climate resilience of farming community by promoting judicious management of natural resources and developing models based on best practices for adaptation.

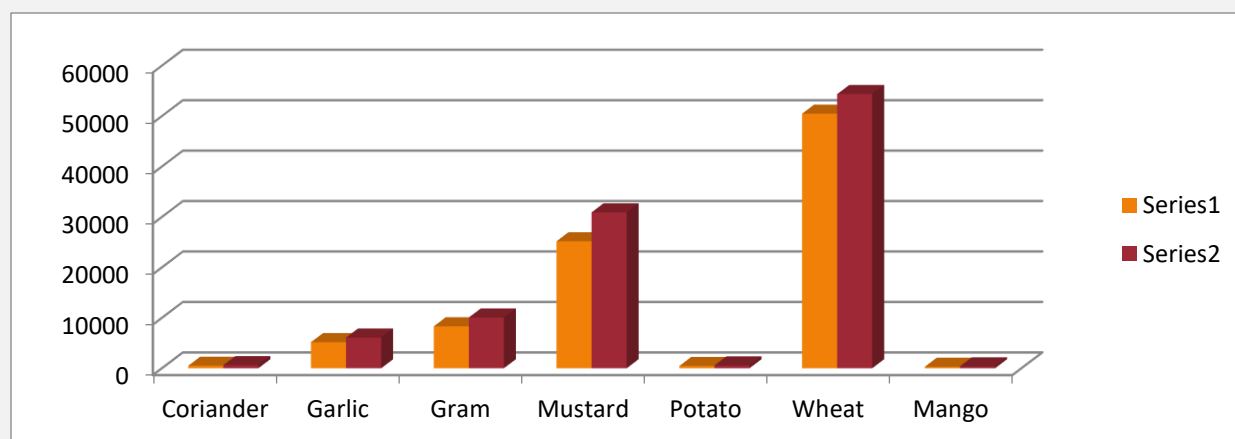

Ujala Milk Producer Awareness Programme

Project introduction- SSSR working with Ujala Milk Producer Company 03 Districts of Kota division, Kota, Baran and Jhalawar. As the name suggests the company deals in milk. The company has opened Milk Collection Centre in selected villages of all these districts. Taking milk from the milk producer members of the village, works to sell it in Mother Dairy. Some percentage of the annual profit is distributed among the members. The company has received financial support from Rajeevika.

Objective & Goal – To make women milk producer's members of Ujalaa Dairy, so that milk producers can get proper benefits of milk



Main activities – One day training program with women milk production members and potential members. We organized 3 trainings at each milk pulling center (MPP), which are as follows-



- 1. Milk Producer Awareness Program (PAP)-** Orient families specially women about the program and Ujala Milk Producer Company and the process of becoming a member of Ujala, member's terms, conditions, responsibilities, benefits, right price of cow and buffalo milk according to fat and transparent and fair milk collection system etc.
- 2. Good Quality and Clean Milk Production Awareness Program (QCMP)-**
During this programme, women members of Milk Pulling Center (MPP) are given training on good quality and clean milk. As-
1. Clean and healthy animals 2. Clean place 3. Clean drinking water 4. Clean stainless steel utensils 5. Wash hands with soap before milking. 6. Wash udder and dry it with clean cloth. 7. Remove first udder separately before milking. 8. Clean milkers . 9. Feed green fodder during milking. 10. Dip in bactericidal solution or on them 11. Cover the milk and take it to the collection center as soon as possible 12. Clean milk collection center and Balanced diet should be given to animals so that the quality of milk increases.
- 3. Women awareness program (WAP) – Training of women for membership condition** and selection of helpers at MPP only women. The payment direct received in the account of women 3 times in a month. Artificial insemination and pregnancy test facility, Heifer registration, Animal infertility prevention camp, Imbalance in diet balance program, Disadvantages of diet and benefits of adopting diet balance program, Silage or green fodder pickle demonstration, Thanela testing facility, Ujala pelleted cattle feed, Information is given about Ujala region special chelated mineral mixture etc.

This year we have organized PAP, QCMP & WAP training in 974 villages. In which 22886 women and 9385 men participated.

Girls Not Brides (GNB) is a global partnership of more than 1600 civil society organizations (CSOs) from over 100 countries based throughout Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas, committed to ending child marriage and enabling girls to fulfil their potential. They share the conviction that every girl has the right to lead the life that she chooses and that, by ending child marriage, we can achieve a safer, healthier and more prosperous future for all.

Girls Not Brides Rajasthan a member of *Girls Not Brides* the Global Partnership to end Child Marriage since December 2018. 34 CSOs and individuals are members in GNB Rajasthan spread over 33 districts of the state; 7 administrative divisions and thus, cover the geographical and social diversity of the entire state.

This study was an attempt to examine the status of girls' education at secondary level in Rajasthan primarily to analyse whether the COVID closure of the schools impacted the retention of girls in secondary classes, perception of parents about their education and importantly the perception on various issues impacted their education especially the dropped-out girls and regular girls. The data from 117 schools was collected spreading in 14 districts covering almost every administrative division of Rajasthan. The school data on enrolment and dropout show a different story since they do not remove the names of dropped out girls from their records since they have the pressure to show increased enrolment per year and they do not accept that the locality has out of school children. Since the scope of the study was limited to the information received from the schools, there are more girls still out of schools than the data reflects. The important part of the study has been the perceptions of parents, dropout girls and regular girls on the different issues related to their studies, family support and future aspirations and constraints. Some of the questions have been same for all the categories and we can see clear contrast in responses.

Gender and Power Study Save the Children-India

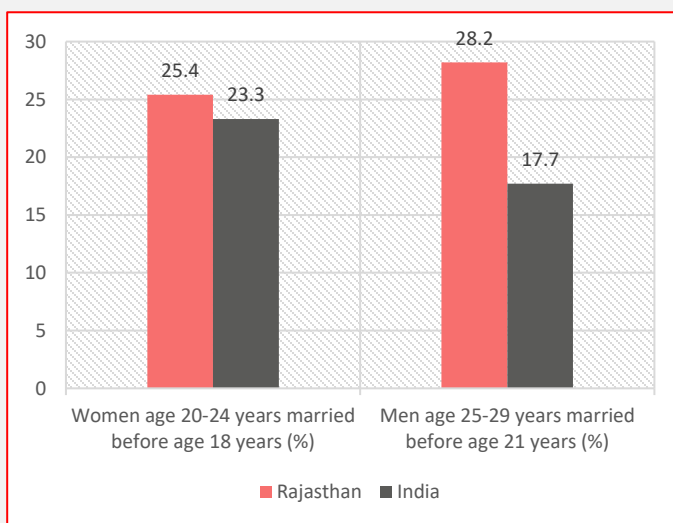
Background :

- Prevalence of child marriage is less among boys as compared to girls however it exists across the regions of the world.
- As per an analysis conducted for 82 countries, 1 in 21 men get married early.
- Profound physical, intellectual, psychological and emotional impacts, cutting off educational opportunity and chances of personal growth.
- An analysis (Edmeades et al.) aimed at exploring the potential drivers of Child, Early and Forced Marriage (CEFM) among men on the basis of most recent Demographic and Health Survey (DHS) and other nationally representative and publicly available data in 59 low and middle income countries (LMICs) between 2003 and 2019 found that boys' CEFM is higher where there is greater availability of and engagement in livelihood opportunities and less engagement in secondary education.
- This study brings out the consistent relationship between the economic indicators linked to "readiness to marry," such as employment and being out of school.



Child Marriage among Boys in Rajasthan-

- Rajasthan is one of the states with highest prevalence of child marriage in India.
- Subsequent rounds of NFHS surveys bring out the disproportionate magnitude of child marriage in the state as compared to national average.
- Relatively, Rajasthan records higher magnitude of child marriage among both girls as well as boys. (NFHS 5)



Objectives of Study

- To ascertain, understand and analyse the behaviors, norms and practices on child marriage among boys.
- To understand the factors and pathways that result in the decision of marriage of boys at a certain age.
- To understand the extent of agency and decision-making of boys in decision about their marriage

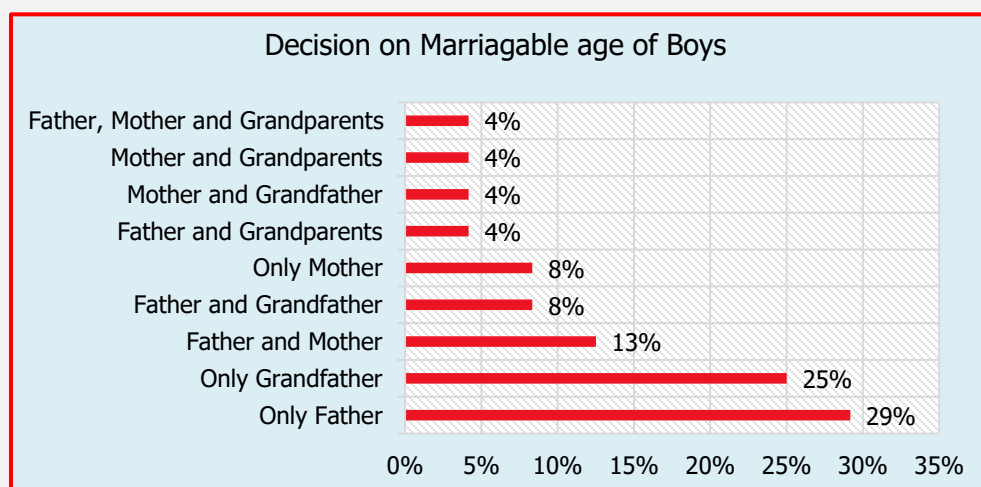


- To understand how gender and power plays significant role in deciding age of marriage among boys

Geography – Sub-district level

- Two blocks (Peeplu & Todaraisingh) perceived to have higher burden of child marriage were selected
- Selection basis the inputs from civil society organisations working on the issue of child marriage in the district.
- Save the Children's programming priority/presence was also given consideration in this selection.
- Selection of panchayats in the selected blocks was also done basis the inputs from CSOs, perspective from socially excluded population and Save the Children's programming
- Selection Panchayats: (Peeplu – Sohela, Handikala) and (Todaraising – Barwas, Indokiya)
- For urban, out of the 45 wards in Tonk municipal council a total of 2 wards were selected (Ward 49 and Ward 8)

Findings- Decisions about when to get the boy married



- Phenomenon of Early Marriage among Boys
- Early marriage of boys below 21 years is a common practice among many families.
- Lack of awareness is a major issue
- Many people conflate the legal age of marriage of boys with that of girls (18 years).
- Struggle in finding suitable girls for boys
- Aata-saata marriages are common

"Those boys who are serious about their studies or those who are in good government jobs are not pressured as they can get married late as well. Families are ready to marry their girls with such boys".

- Lack of stable employment is a risk factor
- Educated or Salaried Boys have a Say in Marriage
- Vulnerable economic situation of families is a risk factor
