Program Activities categorized and described Theme wise as:

Theme I. CHILD RIGHTS (EDUCATION)

ProjectI- Yuvaah Pahal Supported by UNICEF

Project Objective:

Strengthening adolescent and youth group to play an active role in prevention of child marriage, violence against children and strengthening of Yuvaah initiatives in state of Rajasthan” (**Yuwaah Pahal**)

Activities:

Capacity Building Workshop with NSS, NCC, Scouts and Guide-

1561 Youth participate in the capacity building training in 12 college in 6 Districts, including Tonk, Bundi, Kota, Ajmer, Jodhpur and Jaisalmer, targeting youth participants from various organizations, such as NSS (National Service Scheme), Scouts and Guide, NCC and other community youth members. The workshops aimed to cover topics related to Child Rights and Protection, including issues such as Child Marriage, Violence against children and POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences), Child Labour, Cyber Crime and Gender bias discrimination and identities.

Annual/Half yearly Camps to identified disadvantage children and social awareness for Social Security Scheme- 1073 Youth participation in 12 Camps in Colleges. Support to the youth and raise awareness about Social Security Schemes.

Adolescent/Youth Groups - The formation of Adolescent/Youth Groups in 15 panchayats within the Tonk District. 900 Adolescents/youth in 30 groups formed, consisting of 15 boys' groups and 15 girls' groups and regular meeting are taking place with them on Child protection, Child marriage and life skills.

Awareness Raising on Child marriage prevention collaborative effort with District



Administration in Tonk- In collaboration with the Department of Child Rights, Panchayati Raj Department, and Block Administration, a 10 Days vehicle rally conducted in 50 villages to prevent child marriage and raise public awareness. The rally took place from 17th to 21st April and 29th April to 3rd May. The CEO Deshladan and Assistant Director of the Child Rights Department, Naval Khan, flagged off a vehicle adorned with banners containing information on child marriage. During the rally, the project staff and childline staff drove the awareness vehicle for five



days during Akhatij and five days during Peepal Purnima. They broadcasted messages through a microphone and engaged in interactive discussions with the public.

Special Day Celebration (Day Against Child Labour) : On June 14, A one-day vehicle rally with amplified sound was organized in collaboration with Child Line, Police Department, AHTU, CWC, and DCR on the Day Against Child Labour.

- **An essay, art, and other competitions** held in the Harchandera village panchayat on November 18, under the observance of Child Rights Week.

- **On January 12, a National Youth Day celebration** took place at a government school in Bap, Phalodi district, featuring discussions on ongoing collaborative projects and Career Day.

- **On Youth Day, an essay and drawing competition** held at Government School Harchandera, with prizes distributed to outstanding participants.

- **National Girl Child Day-** On January 24, art, essay writing, and sports activities were organized on National Girl Child Day at Government School Devpura, Tonk.

A workshop involving 30 media professionals organized to discuss the role and responsibility of the media in preventing child marriage.



A 'Youth Excellence Centre' has been established in Kathmana village, Tonk district, to provide career counselling and support for mental health issues. The centre has enrolled a total of **74 youth** who are receiving assistance in these areas.

A session on mental health 12 colleges in six districts, wherein NSS volunteers actively participated. The session delved into the concept of mental health, its determinants, and effective stress management strategies, elucidated by

resource persons. Participants gained insights into the intricacies of mental well-being and had their queries addressed by the volunteers. The engagement of all attendees was noteworthy, reflecting a heightened awareness and active involvement.



IEC materials Developed and published for 700 Poster & 3500 Pamphlet on child marriage prevention and awareness. Along with that the IEC on life skills module 50, career guidance book 100, and 100 child marriage book has been developed.

Information, Communication, and Education (ICE) materials were developed on the most prevalent issues in the Tonk district, Child Marriage and Violence against children. A total of 700 Poster & 3500 Pamphlet designed, printed, and distributed among various villages in the Tonk district.

To conclude the project and share progress reports and various case stories, invitations were extended to different departments, private organizations, and community representatives. Some of the invitees included NSS, NYKS, PRI members, media representatives, CWC, Child Line, schools, and youths.

Project 2 - She leads the change Project Supported by Empower US

Project Location- 3 Block (Piploo, Todaraisingh in Tonk and Talera block Bundi districts of Rajasthan.

The objective - **Till June 2023, The Nodal officer will be appointed, Formation of Block level Task force and build the positive environment on the child marriage prevention through advocacy with District collector by 3000 Adolescent girls both (Tonk & Bundi) District.**

Outcomes these three outcomes are as follows –

1. Adolescents will be well informed about their rights and the adverse effects of child marriage and they will be much empowered to raise their voice, needs and rights.
2. Awareness about child marriage will increase at the community level and for its prevention affirmative action and reporting will start in 30 panchayat villages.
3. Nodal officers will be appointed at the panchayat level by formation and activation in 2 districts, 3 blocks and 30 panchayat level child marriage task forces.

Activities-

Quarterly Meeting cum capacity building workshop - Block level Adolescent Federation of 50 girls formed at each sub-division level by selecting 5 adolescent girls from each panchayat of the project area.

Strategy and plan of the federation, after that four quarterly meeting and capacity building workshop on Child marriage affects, causes and legal aspects of child marriage at block level adolescent Federation. Along with this, the capacity of Adolescent Federation enhanced regarding violence, gender discrimination and life skills education, especially self-confidence, empathy, emotion management and effective communication. As a result of the capacity building workshop and regular interactions,

Achievement - 71 adolescent girls refused their child marriage and 5 child marriage cases from the project area registered on Child Line.

Monthly Meetings with Federation Member

Monthly meetings are organized with the members at the panchayat level to increase the capacity of Adolescent Federation members; each panchayat is discussed with five members. Federation members share the discussion held in the meeting with other girls in their school and locality. During the monthly meeting Information was shared on social schemes, various helplines, special day events and child protection issues and mechanisms. Participations: 112 in April Month, 26 Group/194 Adolescents in May 2023 and 30

Exposure and dialogue of Adolescent Federation with Child Marriage Prevention Mechanism at Block & District Level.

: Adolescent Federation members Exposure visit/ educational tour at the block Todaraising 32 member on dated 11th April 2023 and 25 Member at Talera Block in Bundi District on dated 3rd May 2023, interacted with the Child Marriage Prohibition Officer and the district level child protection system and made their understanding on the process and reporting system related to child marriage.

During the dialogue, the girls asked questions like where to report child marriage, how child marriage can be Annulment, how privacy will be ensured in the control room. During the dialogue at the district level, the girls discussed issues like child labor and human trafficking with the Anti-Human Trafficking Police Unit, as well as communicating with the child welfare committee members and child line members

Workshops with religious leaders and service providers of marriage programs on reporting and prevention of child marriage at the block level in association with Nodal officers-

- All the service providers like Pandit, Maulvi Printing Press, Tent Operator, Halwai were enlisted and workshop orders were issued by the Nodal Officer/Sub-Divisional Officer at Block level. During the workshop, information about Child Marriage Prohibition Act 2006 was given and information about fine and imprisonment was given for participating in child marriage. Ban letters were issued to all service providers by the Child Marriage Prohibition Officer. Oath was administered not to participate in child marriage and motivated to report child marriage to control room and child line.

Organize Awareness Drive on Child Marriage Through a Decorated Vehicle with Sound, Hoardings, Posters and Pamphlets.- From 17 April 2023 to 26 April 2023, a 10-day child marriage awareness and prevention campaign was conducted. The campaign started from the District Collectorate Office in Tonk flagged off by Chief Executive Officer Deshladan and District Child Protection Officer/Assistant Director Child Empowerment Department Naval Khan. In 20 panchayats of Peeplu and Todaraisingh blocks. The community aware of the adverse effects of child marriage, the main provisions of the law and the number of the control room along with the information about the schemes that are available for getting married at the right age. Similarly, the campaign was conducted in Bundi from April 1 to April 5, 2023. Under the campaign, the message was disseminated to about 5000 people and more than 300 girls were connected through Nukkad Charcha. From this campaign A positive environment created against child marriage in Three block and 2 Districts..

Training of District & Block level Child Marriage Task Force- Capacity building workshop organized with district and block level child marriage prevention task force members. During the workshop, the 114 members informed about the Rajasthan State Child Marriage Prevention Strategy under the Sajha Abhiyan for prevention of child marriage and under that, the objectives of formation of child marriage prevention task force at the district, block and panchayat level were also informed to the members. Giving information about their work role and making the child marriage prevention system active and effective was discussed.

District & Block Marriage Task force Formation and Quarterly Meetings for action on Child Marriage Prevention -Child marriage prevention task force Form/re-formation in collaboration with the district administration and subdivision administration for effective action on child marriage and meetings organized at quarterly level to take action and provide capacity building on the subject of child marriage, planning for prevention of child marriage, enlisting and banning service providers, identifying potential child marriages and doing prevention process, knowing the progress of action in reported child marriage cases, formation of task force at panchayat level And the training program was discussed. 07th April 23 with 18 Member in Piploo 04th April 23 with 17 member in Todaraising 11th April 23 with 15 Member in Talera Block

Formation and Capacity building of Child Marriage Task Force at panchayat Level on Quarterly Meeting - In 30 gram panchayats of the project area, dialogue regarding formation of panchayat level task force according to the earlier order of the Panchayati Raj Department agreed to constitute Panchayat level Child Protection Committees and make them work as a task force. Quarterly meetings are being organized in all 30 panchayats in April 2023 with 629 (M-325, F-304) Members and action is



being taken after discussing various issues of child protection like child marriage, violence, molestation, Gender Discrimination, Education, and Social Scheme.

Exposure to experience sharing of adolescent girls- On 27 and 28 June 2023, the girls of Peeplu Todaraisingh and Talera blocks for an educational tour to Bundi. During the educational visit, the process of Ujala Clinic operated under the National Adolescent Health Program was known, along with the adolescent girls discussed among them, knowing each other's experiences and discussing the challenges, and discussed the solutions. During this 50 adolescent girls participated

Dissemination workshop organized with service providers- Dissemination workshop was organized on 30th June 2023 at Darda Turki of Peeplu block. During the workshop, the community was informed about the various works done under the project and the issue of child marriage prevention and awareness was interacted with the service providers. In which strengthening of child protection system, especially child marriage prevention system was discussed. 40 (M-17, F-17, G-2, B-1, Staff-3) members participated during the workshop.

Special Day Celebration:

Menstrual Hygiene Day was celebrated with 80 adolescent girls in the project area on 28 May 2023. In which information was given on menstruation management and prevention of infectious diseases.

Project 3- CHILDLINE PROGRAMME (Child Helpline 1098)

Goal of the Project

Compositions of Child Friend Nation where children ensure their rights and see the citizens of the nation as a contribution.

Objective: Reaching out and assisting children seeking care and protection through helpline number 1098.

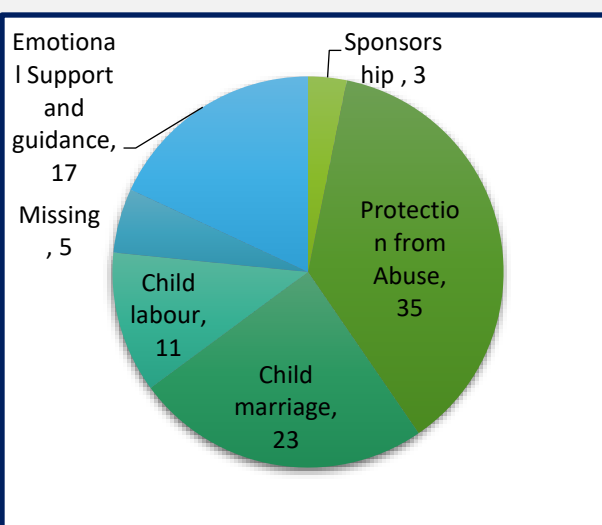
Target Group:- Children in Need of Care and Protection (CNCP)

Work Area:- Entire Tonk

Activities:

Received and Resolved cases: During the months of April to October 2023, 94 phone calls received on Child line. The detailed description of the cases received by dividing them into different categories is as follows: After receiving the case, a team was sent to intervene and the case was resolved by providing assistance to the child in collaboration with the concerned department.

Outreach & Open House: Outreach and open house activities to spread information about Child Line for community and every child. Discuss on child marriage, child labour, child sexual abuse, safe and unsafe touch and child rights during





open houses and outreach in villages, communities, slums, Anganwadi, bus stands, industrial areas, schools etc. demonstrated and pamphlets distributed giving detailed information about the types of cases that come to Child line and how help is provided to the child. 135 Outreach and 6 Open House conducted in Community. 650 women, men, children and public representatives participated during the Open House.

Awareness program : The Child Marriage Prevention and Awareness Program campaign organized in the month of April 2023 flagged off by Zilla Parishad Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Deshaldan. And during Drive dissemination of pamphlets for prevention of child marriage in villages. 365 children and 205 adults given information through the campaign.

Poster of Child Labour Free Tonk Campaign released by District Collector Mrs. Chinmay Gopal on International Child Labour Prohibition Day.

Awareness Raising through vehicle on International Prohibition of Child Labour- The drive flagoff by



ASP- anti-human trafficking unit – Ms. Geeta Choudhary & Child Line team. During the campaign activities - oath taking, signature campaign conducted participation- 215 Children and 300 Adults reach.

Participated in Mega legal awareness program organized by District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) Tonk in August Month.

During this, the benefits of public welfare schemes being run by the state government through various departments were given on the spot. During this, Child Line team helped the people through the stall informed about plans. 200 People Benefited in this Camp.

Collaboration and coordination with district level departments:

Participated in DCPU (District Child Protection Unit) Meeting in July & September Months with 35 Participants and Discussion on child Marriage prevention strategy, Child Labour and Progress on Child Welfare Committee, Government Observation and Juvenile Home, Non-Government Children's Home, POCSO Cases.

Participated in Kushi -VII Campaign Run by Police Department for searching minor missing children in August Month with 45 Participants.

Participated in District Level Task Force Meeting conducted by Women Empowerment Department Under the chairmanship of District Collector in September Month. During this meeting Discussed on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Yojana, Udaan Yojana, and District Mahila Samadhan Samiti works and developed next Plans with 30 Participants.

Participated in Block Level Public Hearing organized by National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) at Piploo Government Higher Secondary School, during this the Child Line team helped in the arrangements of the camp.



Total REACH Through All Activity: Through open house, outreach, case intervention, awareness programs, information about Child line was given to 3500 Children, 4500 adult and 445 stake Holders during the program period.

Project 4 – Girls led advocacy for increased access to education

Objective - By September 2024, Ms. Sangita Beniwal, Chairperson, RSCPCR, will issue notification for activating District level Redressal Mechanisms under RTE Forum across the state. This will benefit overall 9977083 students enrolled in Govt. schools including 5043540 Girls.

Outcomes :

1. To build leadership capacity of 280 girls to raise awareness on girl child education, provision of free education and redressal mechanism in third quarter (May 2024) of the project implementation.
2. By October 2024, the effective mechanism of RTE rules at Schools through Girls participation in SMC/SDMCs.
3. By November 2024, Promoting active participation RTE forum & Grievance Redressal Committee members.

Activities:

One on one meeting with DEO for permission to work in 14 schools: for Project sharing and Received an Order for work at 14 schools in Piploo block.

Identification of 280 potential girl leaders from 14 schools of Piploo block: Student enrollments, status of RTE facilities, list of Meena and Gargi Manch members, list of SMC and SDMC members received from 14 Schools.

210 Meena Manch Girls and 140 Gargi Manch Girls identified and 5 schools agree on restructuring of Meena and Gargi Manch. Developed a tool for meetings data collection and individual member attendance tracking.

Conduct monthly meetings with Girl leaders to discuss about Meena Manch, Life skill and Education: 28 meetings held on No Bag Day in 14 schools with 210 Meena and Gargi Manch girls on introduction sessions, sharing of project objectives, and concept of Meena Manch. During the meeting Girls showed eagerness to learn something new.

Celebration of National Girls Day: Celebration of National girl's day in Government Higher Secondary School Kathmana with 245 Students. 2 Girls get In charge of School Principal and vice principal, 8 Girls Participated in Drawing Activity and Discussion on 2 Local change maker Girls Story. A positive environment established for girls' education and co-scholastic activities in the school.

Quarterly meeting for Strengthening SMC/SDMC members on RTE norm: Trained to member on school Development Plan (SDP) , capacity building of Meena and Gargi Manch and upcoming plans on 11 January and 9 February, 2024.

SMC/SDMC Training: Residential training of School Management Committee and School Development and Management Committee organized by the Education Department at the Panchayat level from 7 to 10 January. 186 School Management Committee members understood their work responsibilities and the role of SMC.



Meeting with District Collector for activation of RTE Grievance Redressal Committee: Meeting with District Collector Dr. Soumya Jha for RTE grievance redressal committee activation, strengthening of SMC/SDMC in Schools. Presentation of Progress, project objective.

Formation of RTE grievance redressal mechanism organized on 20th March at Peeplu Block and on 26th March at Tonk District Headquarters.

Organizing quarterly meetings regarding sensitization with teacher training cell and Resource person: On 19 February, a quarterly meeting organized with 05

Resource persons for teacher training in Piploo block. Discuss on increase girl participation, school development planning and school management committee workshop.

IEC publications: Printing & design in the structure and work responsibilities of the members of 7 School Development and Management Committees and 14 School Management Committees. And 100 booklets were prepared regarding the structure of Meena Manch and Gargi Manch, issues and work responsibilities of monthly meetings. 21 banners ready, 100 booklets are in the process of being published.

Meeting with Rajasthan State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (RSCPCR): On 14 February, a meeting was organized by Project Director Dr. Shivji Ram Yadav and Project Officer Poonam Jonwal on sharing of project information with RSCPCR members at the state level.

Project 5- The Pilot Education Initiative Supported by WSUS

Project titled "Girls to complete secondary school and have the skills necessary to negotiate key life decisions" is being implemented in Phalodi, Western Rajasthan from October 2023.

This intervention aims to encourage more girls to enrol in schools and stay in school until completion of their secondary education and through Life Skills Education, involve parents and communities in promoting the importance of girl child education and Vocational Skills for employability by September 2023.

The major focus of the Pilot intervention is on Academic Inputs, Life Skills, Sports for Development and Promoting the culture of higher education among the rural poor. The Pilot initiative aims to engage the Girl child at Middle and High school but at the core focus will be the quality improvement in education and Leadership through deepening learning and system strengthening.

The initiative aims to engage at least 1000 girls, where the core focus will be the Transition from secondary school to college and learning a vocational skill for employability and empowerment.



Under the initiative, 1000 will be equipped with vocational skill and Academic inputs. This will encourage girls to continue their studies and develop awareness in the community towards the importance of Girl Child Education.

Internal Staff Capacity-Building Training organized by SSSR:

The SSSR's WSUS-SSSR Education Pilot Education Initiative held a two-day Staff Capacity Building Training at Baap, focusing on empowering educators and leaders to support girl child education. Discussions included long-term community benefits and innovative teaching approaches. Inclusivity was emphasized with presentations on creating gender-sensitive learning environments, supported by case studies from Western Rajasthan.

The Annual Project Staff Capacity Building initiative continued with ongoing training sessions, emphasizing field monitoring, and team capacity building.

Notably, 15 volunteers actively participated, contributing to fear-free environments and successful initiatives, showcasing the commitment to project effectiveness and community engagement.

Week Long celebration on Child Rights

WSUS Team Education celebrated Child Rights Week at Bari Sid and other parts of Baap block through its implementation partner Shiv Shiksha Samiti. The major attraction of this week was raising awareness in the community for Girl Child Education and rights of women for empowerment.



Most of the discussion went around Children's rights include the right to health, education, family life, play and recreation, an adequate standard of living and to be protected from abuse and harm.

The theme for World Children's Day 2023 is '**For Every Child, Every Right!**'

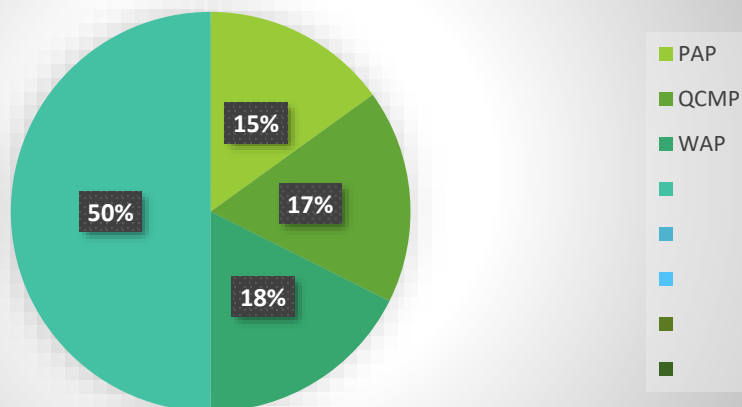

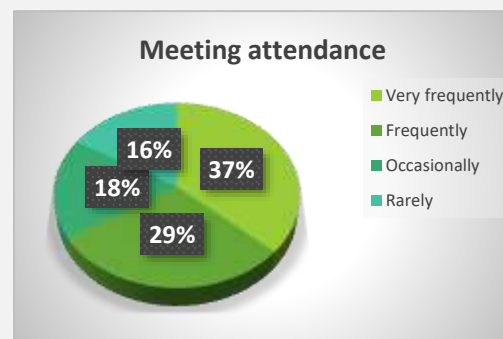

Project: 3 Ujala Milk Producer Awareness Programme

Project introduction- SSSR working with Ujala Milk Producer Company 03 Districts of Kota division, Kota, Baran and Jhalawar. As the name suggests the company deals in milk. The company has opened Milk Collection Centre in selected villages of all these districts. Taking milk from the milk producer members of the village, works to sell it in Mother Dairy. Some percentage of the annual profit is distributed among the members. The company has received financial support from Rajeevika.

Objective & Goal – To make women milk producer's members of Ujalaa Dairy, so that milk producers can get proper benefits of milk

Main activities – One day training program with women milk production members and potential members. We organized 3 trainings at each milk pulling center (MPP), which are as follows-

1. **Milk Producer Awareness Program (PAP)**- Orient families specially women about the program and Ujala Milk Producer Company and the process of becoming a member of Ujala, member's terms, conditions, responsibilities, benefits, right price of cow and buffalo milk according to fat and transparent and fair milk collection system etc.

2. **Good Quality and Clean Milk Production Awareness Program (QCMP)**-

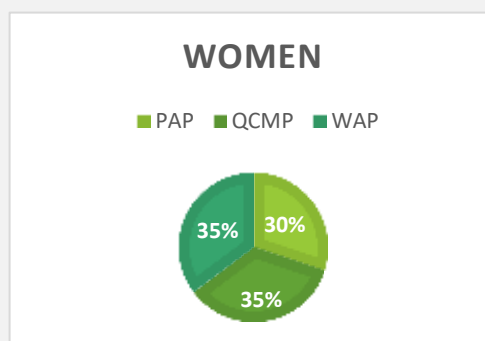
During this program, women members of Milk Pulling Center (MPP) are given training on good quality and clean milk. As-

1. Clean and healthy animals
2. Clean place
3. Clean drinking water
4. Clean stainless-steel utensils
5. Wash hands with soap before milking.
6. Wash udder and dry it with clean cloth.
7. Remove first udder separately before milking.
8. Clean milkers.
9. Feed green fodder during milking.
10. Dip in bactericidal solution or on them



11. Cover the milk and take it to the collection center as soon as possible
12. Clean milk collection center and Balanced diet should be given to animals so that the quality of milk increases.

3. **Women awareness program (WAP)** – Training of women for membership condition and selection of helpers at MPP only women. The payment direct received in the account of women 3 times in a month. Artificial insemination and pregnancy test facility, Heifer registration, Animal infertility prevention camp, Imbalance in diet balance program, Disadvantages of diet and benefits of adopting diet balance program, Silage or green fodder pickle demonstration, Thanela testing facility, Ujala pelleted cattle feed, Information is given about Ujala region special chelated mineral mixture etc.



This year we have organized PAP, QCMP & WAP training in 580 villages with 19339 participants.

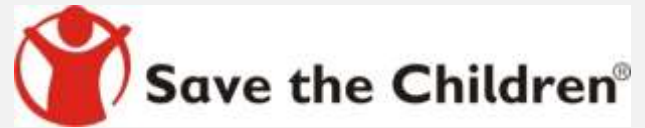
